



Demographic Trends Affecting U.S. Foreign Policy

Dr. Steven Philip Kramer has been Professor of National Security Studies at the Eisenhower School, National Defense University in Washington, D.C. since 1992. From 1996-2002 he was also Senior Policy Advisor to the Assistant Secretary of State for European Affairs where he focused on long-term issues and France. In spring-summer 2011 he was a Public Policy Scholar at the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars where he completed a book on *The Other Population Crisis: What Governments can do about Falling Birthrates* published by Wilson Center/Johns Hopkins Press in January 2014.

His books include *Does France Still Count?: The French Role in the New Europe*, Praeger/CSIS, 1994, *Socialism in Western Europe: The Experience of a Generation* and a biography of the cineaste Abel Gance. Recent articles include "The End of French Europe" in *Foreign Affairs*, July 2006, "Baby Gap: How to Boost Birth Rates and Avoid Demographic Decline," *Foreign Affairs*, 2012, "The Return of History in Europe," *Washington Quarterly* 2012. He is also author of "The Return of Spain's Sephardim," *Hedgehog Review*, Fall 2013.

Professor Kramer received his B.A. in History from Brandeis University and his Ph.D. from Princeton University.
