



Europe's Perception of U.S. Foreign Policy

Juliette Tolay is assistant professor of political science and public policy at Penn State Harrisburg. She earned a doctorate degree in global governance from the University of Delaware. Her doctoral thesis was on the Turkish political culture on immigration, called *Turkey's Worldviews: Toward a Comparative Political Theory of Migration*.

A native of France, Dr. Tolay studied at Sciences Po in Paris, at the Institut National des Langues et Civilisations Orientales in Paris, and at Galatasaray Universitesi in Istanbul.

She has published extensively on immigration into Turkey, more specifically public opinion of foreigners in Turkey; immigration and asylum in the European Union - Turkey relations, and Turkish immigration policies intersection with domestic and foreign policies.

Dr. Tolay is a former fellow at the Transatlantic Academy where she conducted research on Turkish foreign policy and co-authored the book *Turkey and Its Neighbors: Foreign Relations in Transition*, Lynne Rienner, 2011.

Dr. Tolay is the 2010 recipient of the first prize of the Sakip Sabanci International Research Award for a paper on multiculturalism in Turkey.

In addition to immigration and Turkey, her other research interests include European politics and Middle Eastern politics. She has taught courses on international relations, U.S. foreign policy and international law.

Dr. Tolay's journal articles include: "Deconstructing Turkish Public Attitudes Towards Refugees: Empowering Rights Over Politicization and Self-Gratification," "Discovering Immigration into Turkey: The Emergence of a Dynamic Field," and "The Missed Dialogues of the Euro-Turkish Relationship."

Her book chapters include: "The Legal and Institutional Framework of Asylum Policy in Turkey: Towards More Protection?" and "Turkey's Critical Europeanization: Evidence from Turkey's Immigration Policies."
